

Education Committee Report

The Education Committee responded to a dozen requests for information in the Turtle Lake area throughout this past year. Requests varied from information on proper procedures for filling gas into boats, cleaning up spillage, plant and animal species in the area, shoreline development protocol, right of way of waterlines on public property, construction of drainage channels and resultant flow into the lake. Some requests were re-directed to the proper organizations for further information.

This winter, students from Turtleford conducted the second Ice-fishers Survey, the results of which were shared at a director's meeting earlier this year.

The TLWI website continues to be updated and accessed regularly.

The annual shoreline cleanup was again successful. Held the week of July 3-11, the cleanup was of particular importance due to the high water levels and winds we have experienced this spring and summer, resulting in an increased amount of broken wooden structures and wind blown and washed out objects. It appears that lake users are making a concerted effort to keep the lake clean under the circumstances. Deliberate dumping of material appears to be non-existent. It is anticipated that more objects may be washed into the lake accidentally because of the high water levels, winds and rain.
