Other Points of Interest

- Snags (dead trees) - great for bird watching
- Fallen Tree - home to insects
- Drumming Log - Male Ruffed Grouse use this log for 'drumming'; rapidly beating their wings to attract female grouse.
- Oldest Tree - White Spruce. This tree is over 150 years old.
- Prairie Lily - Saskatchewan's official provincial flower. This flower is protected and illegal to pick.
- Marsh Marigold - From the Buttercup family, this small, golden flower grows in swamps and along stream edges.
